SUBJECT: CONTRACT AWARD/ Replacement of a Generator at Fire Station 2

In May, 2018, I received a request to procure replacement of a generator at Fire Station 2 in the Town of Natick. The estimated cost was \$25,000 to \$35,000. Typically, this requires a "public notification and quote process," per M.G.L. c. 149, §44A (meaning we advertise and also affirmatively solicit three (3) written quotes). However, we were able to make use of the Operational Services Division (OSD) Contract TRD01. Under the terms of TRD01, we are still required to seek three (3) written quotes, applying prevailing wage requirements. However, per the statute, if we receive quotes from at least two (2) vendors on TRD01 (a state OSD contract), we are not required to advertise. In this case, we solicited four (4) quotes (three (3) from TRD01) and received two quotes on TRD01, as per the attached. Hence, advertising was not required.

The lowest quote received (\$20,103.69) was submitted by South Shore Generator, Inc. South Shore Generator, Inc. is listed as a vendor on TRD01. South Shore Generator, Inc. has also been deemed a responsible and eligible entity. Kenneth Fisher, Equipment Maintenance Division Supervisor, has reviewed its background and references, and is satisfied with its reviews.

We recommend that the Natick Board of Selectmen award the contract to South Shore Generator, Inc. for \$20,103.69 for all work outlined in the quote. Please advise if you have any questions or require additional information.

Re: Public Notification and Quote Process - Fire Station 2 Generator Replacement

Date: July 9, 2018

In May, 2018, I received a procurement request for the replacement of the generator at Fire Station 2 in Natick.

The requisite statutory reference governing the building of a public work/shelter is M.G.L. c. 149, §44A, which provides, in relevant part, as follows:

(B) Every contract for the construction, reconstruction, installation, demolition, maintenance or repair of any building estimated to cost not less than \$10,000 but not more than \$50,000 shall be awarded to the responsible person offering to perform the contract at the lowest price. The public agency shall make public notification of the contract and shall seek written responses from no fewer than 3 persons who customarily perform such work. The solicitation shall include a scope-of-work statement that defines the work to be performed and provides potential responders with sufficient information regarding the objectives and requirements of the public agency and the time period within which the work shall be completed. The public agency shall record the names and addresses of all persons from whom written responses were sought, the names of the persons submitting written responses and the date and amount of each written response. A public agency may utilize a vendor list established through a statewide contract procured through the operational services division to identify 1 or more of the persons from whom it will seek written responses for purposes of this paragraph. A public agency may also procure a blanket contract to establish a listing of vendors in certain defined categories of work that are under contract to provide services for multiple individual tasks of not more than \$50,000 each, and from whom written responses will be sought. Any such blanket contract procured by the awarding authority shall be procured pursuant to either section 39M of chapter 30 or sections 44A to 44J, inclusive, of chapter 149 which are applicable to projects over \$50,000. For purposes of this paragraph, the term "public notification" shall include, but not be limited to, posting at least 2 weeks before the time specified in the notification for the receipt of responses, the contract and scope-of-work statement: (1) on the website of the public agency, (2) on the COMMBUYS system administered by the operational services division, (3) in the central register published pursuant to section 20A of chapter 9 and (4) in a conspicuous place in or near the primary office of the public agency; provided, however, that if the public agency obtains a minimum of 2 written responses from a vendor list established through a blanket contract or a statewide contract procured through the operational services division, and the lowest of those written responses is deemed acceptable to the public agency, public notification is not required.

This is now known as the "quote plus public notification" process, requiring both quotes and public advertising and award to the responsible bidder offering the lowest price (of all from whom quotes sought and from those who responded to the public notification process.)

We were also able to make use of the Operational Services Division Contract OSD TRD01. This contract requires, for work between \$10,000 and \$50,000, the Town to solicit at least three (3) quotes and to obtain at least two (2) quotes from those on the contract. The benefit to the use of the OSD contract was the ability to dispense with the advertising requirement.

#### WRITTEN PURCHASE DESCRIPTION:

I received a written purchase description, which was incorporated into the Request for Responses/Request for Quotes:

It provided as follows:

# WRITTEN PURCHASE DESCRIPTION FOR FIRE STATION NO. 2 GENERATOR REPLACEMENT

The Town of Natick desires to purchase a replacement generator for Fire Station No. 2, which is located at 45 Eliot Street in South Natick, Massachusetts.

The Town desires to purchase a generator that is at least twenty-one (21) KW, and that is natural gas 120/240 volt, 1 phase, and 60 HZ. It shall feature a weather-resistant, sound deadening enclosure. The engine for the generator shall have a 50C ambient radiator and an electronic isochronous governor. The alternator for the generator shall feature a brushless rotating field generator and shall be four (4) lead wired 240 V 1phase. It shall also have an automatic voltage regulator.

The generator unit ("the unit") shall feature a main circuit breaker, with at least 90Amp and shall be mounted and wired in a NEMA 1 enclosure. It shall have a digital generator control panel. It shall feature an engine block heater of at least 1000W 120V AC rated for -20 degrees F. It shall also have a 12 volt lead acid battery, battery rack and cables. Its weather protective enclosure shall be a 16 gauge galvanized steel and shall have internal baffling and 1" foam for sound attenuation. It shall be powder coated. It shall have a formed steel base with mounting and lifting holes and shall have vibration mounts to isolate the unit from the base rail. It shall have a silencer mounted to the engine with the enclosure.

The unit shall be placed upon a pre-cast concrete pad- The one existing may be used; however, it may need to be adjusted slightly size-wise, depending upon the unit.

The unit shall feature an oil drain kit, shall be initially filled with lube oil and anti-freeze. It shall have standard factory testing, and shall feature a standard two (2)-year to three (3)-year warranty. The unit shall be certified to UL2200 standards.

The Successful Responder shall deliver the unit FOB factory to job site, offloading and installation by the Successful Responder.

The Successful Responder shall remove the existing generator shed and shall dispose of the same. The Successful Responder shall remove and shall deliver the existing Onan generator to the Town for storage. Thereafter, the Town may dispose of Generator in accordance with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, rules, and regulations. The Town shall be responsible for storage of the existing unit. Nothing herein, however, shall be construed as binding the Town to dispose of the unit.

The Successful Responder shall be responsible for obtaining all applicable electrical and gas permits.

The Successful Responder shall wire the new generator, shall replace the transfer switch and shall install a new 100 amp meter socket and new service entrance drop.

The Successful Responder shall provide a unit that complies with all NFPA and building code compliant standards.

Payment shall be compliant with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, rules, and regulations. The Town shall not be responsible for interest for late payments.

The Successful Responder shall furnish to the Town copies of all insurance certificates it maintains and shall list the Town as an additional insured for all commercial general liability, automobile (hired and owned autos), and excess/umbrella insurance.

The Successful Responder shall be responsible for payment of the attached minimum prevailing wage rates and shall comply with all state reporting requirements.

The Successful Responder shall deliver at least one (1) hard copy operations and maintenance manual to the Town and shall provide delivery, installation, startup, and testing. Conditions and terms shall comply with Operational Services Division (OSD) Contract TRD01. The Town shall not have a separate, full contract, but shall issue a purchase order, incorporating all terms and conditions of OSD ContractTRD01.

#### PUBLIC NOTIFICATION:

As we are using TRD01, public notification is NOT required, per M.G.L. c. 149, §44A.

- 2. South Shore Generator submitted a quote of \$20,103.69 to perform the required services.

Milton CAT and New England Generator declined to provide a quote to provide the required service.

#### RESPONSE TABULATION

No responses were received, as no public solicitation was involved.

The lowest overall quote/response was that of South Shore Generator which submitted the lowest price of \$20,103.69 to perform the above work.

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#### AWARD RECOMMENDATION

Award should be made, if at all, to South Shore Generator, the lowest responsible and eligible responder. It submitted a price of \$20,103.69 to perform the above work.

UPDATES: This contract is a rolling enrollment contract which allows potential bidders an opportunity to submit bid responses for the trade of interest up until 2/28/28.

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This contract is to be used for construction, reconstruction, alteration, installation, demolition, maintenance or repair services and, if needed, associated materials. It is the responsibility of the Eligible Entity to consult their legal counsel for assistance determining whether installation work includes construction as defined by M.G.L. c.149 or M.G.L. c.30, §39M. Services provided under this contract (i.e. labor) are limited to \$50,000 or less per engagement. OSD does not provide guidance on this. Questions around the Construction Law must be directed to the Eligible Entities legal counsel, AG and/or IG.

Eligible Entities will be allowed to contract with any contractor under Statewide Contract TRD01 for services for building or public works construction projects estimated to cost **less than \$10,000** without the need to solicit multiple written price quotations when procuring these services, unless required by the eligible entity's internal procurement policies and requirements. Eligible Entities must use sound business practices which require a record that includes, at a minimum, the name and address of the person from whom the services were procured.

If using Statewide Contract TRD01 for services for c. 149 building construction or c. 30, s. 39M public works projects estimated to cost between \$10,000 and \$49,999.00 (this amount is capped for labor only), public agencies will be required to solicit at a minimum responses from at least three (3) TRD01 contractors and MUST receive two (2) written responses, provided that the contract shall be awarded to the responsible person offering to perform the contract at the lowest price quotation. If the project requires additional equipment/parts/materials the costs associated with such equipment/parts/materials may exceed \$50,000 cost limit.

Construction projects exceeding these limits are not permitted under this contract. Additionally, MGL c. 7C, ss. 44-57, Design Services for Public Building Projects, is outside the scope of this statewide contract.

In instances where Statewide Contract TRD01 is used for services in excess of \$25,000, MGL c. 149, s. 29 payment bonds are required from the selected Contractor. It is the responsibility of the eligible entity to enforce this requirement when soliciting quotes.


#### Directly purchase fixed price items through COMMBUYS

#### **Quotes Including Construction Services**

- Where the construction services are less than \$10,000: Select a vendor based on sound business practices, consistent with your entity's procurement policies and procedures.
- For construction services valued from \$10,000-\$50,000: Must solicit a minimum of three quotes and receive two written responses; award to lowest responsible bidder.

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#### **Prevailing Wage Requirements**

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#### WRITTEN PURCHASE DESCRIPTION FOR FIRE STATION NO. 2 GENERATOR REPLACEMENT

The Town of Natick desires to purchase a replacement generator for Fire Station No. 2, which is located at 45 Eliot Street in South Natick, Massachusetts.

The Town desires to purchase a generator that is at least twenty-one (21) KW, and that is natural gas 120/240 volt, 1 phase, and 60 HZ. It shall feature a weather-resistant, sound deadening enclosure. The engine for the generator shall have a 50C ambient radiator and an electronic isochronous governor. The alternator for the generator shall feature a brushless rotating field generator and shall be four (4) lead wired 240 V 1phase. It shall also have an automatic voltage regulator.

The generator unit ("the unit") shall feature a main circuit breaker, with at least 90Amp and shall be mounted and wired in a NEMA 1 enclosure. It shall have a digital generator control panel. It shall feature an engine block heater of at least 1000W 120V AC rated for -20 degrees F. It shall also have a 12 volt lead acid battery, battery rack and cables. Its weather protective enclosure shall be a 16 gauge galvanized steel and shall have internal baffling and 1" foam for sound attenuation. It shall be powder coated. It shall have a formed steel base with mounting and lifting holes and shall have vibration mounts to isolate the unit from the base rail. It shall have a silencer mounted to the engine with the enclosure.

The unit shall be placed upon a pre-cast concrete pad- The one existing may be used; however, it may need to be adjusted slightly size-wise, depending upon the unit.

The unit shall feature an oil drain kit, shall be initially filled with lube oil and anti-freeze. It shall have standard factory testing, and shall feature a standard two (2)-year to three (3)-year warranty. The unit shall be certified to UL2200 standards.

The Successful Responder shall deliver the unit FOB factory to job site, offloading and installation by the Successful Responder.

The Successful Responder shall remove the existing generator shed and shall dispose of the same. The Successful Responder shall remove and shall deliver the existing Onan generator to the Town for storage. Thereafter, the Town may dispose of Generator in accordance with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, rules, and regulations. The Town shall be responsible for storage of the existing unit. Nothing herein, however, shall be construed as binding the Town to dispose of the unit.

The Successful Responder shall be responsible for obtaining all applicable electrical and gas permits.

The Successful Responder shall wire the new generator, shall replace the transfer switch and shall install a new 100 amp meter socket and new service entrance drop.

The Successful Responder shall provide a unit that complies with all NFPA and building code compliant standards.

Payment shall be compliant with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, rules, and regulations. The Town shall not be responsible for interest for late payments.

The Successful Responder shall furnish to the Town copies of all insurance certificates it maintains and shall list the Town as an additional insured for all commercial general liability, automobile (hired and owned autos), and excess/umbrella insurance.

The Successful Responder shall be responsible for payment of the attached minimum prevailing wage rates and shall comply with all state reporting requirements.

The Successful Responder shall deliver at least one (1) hard copy operations and maintenance manual to the Town and shall provide delivery, installation, startup, and testing. - An Awarding Authority must request an updated wage schedule from the Department of Labor Standards ("DLS") if it has not opened bids or selected a contractor within 90 days of the date of issuance of the wage schedule. For CM AT RISK projects (bid pursuant to G.L. c.149A), the earlier of: (a) the execution date of the GMP Amendment, or (b) the bid for the first construction scope of work must be within 90-days of the wage schedule issuance date.
- The wage schedule shall be incorporated in any advertisement or call for bids for the project as required by M.G.L. c. 149, § 27. The wage schedule shall be made a part of the contract awarded for the project. The wage schedule must be posted in a conspicuous place at the work site for the life of the project in accordance with M.G.L. c. 149 § 27. The wages listed on the wage schedule must be paid to employees performing construction work on the project whether they are employed by the prime contractor, a filed sub-bidder, or any sub-contractor.
- All apprentices working on the project are required to be registered with the Massachusetts Department of Labor Standards, Division of Apprentice Standards (DLS/DAS). Apprentice must keep his/her apprentice identification card on his/her person during all work hours on the project. An apprentice registered with DAS may be paid the lower apprentice wage rate at the applicable step as provided on the prevailing wage schedule. Any apprentice not registered with DLS/DAS regardless of whether or not they are registered with any other federal, state, local, or private agency must be paid the journeyworker's rate for the trade.
- The wage rates will remain in effect for the duration of the project, except in the case of multi-year public construction projects. For construction projects lasting longer than one year, awarding authorities must request an updated wage schedule. Awarding authorities are required to request these updates no later than two weeks before the anniversary of the date the contract was executed by the awarding authority and the general contractor. For multi-year CM AT RISK projects, awarding authority must request an annual update no later than two weeks before the anniversary date, determined as the earlier of: (a) the execution date of the GMP Amendment, or (b) the execution date of the first amendment to permit procurement of construction services. Contractors are required to obtain the wage schedules from awarding authorities, and to pay no less than these rates to covered workers. The annual update requirement is not applicable to 27F "rental of equipment" contracts.
- Every contractor or subcontractor which performs construction work on the project is required to submit weekly payroll reports and a Statement of Compliance directly to the awarding authority by mail or email and keep them on file for three years. Each weekly payroll report must contain: the employee's name, address, occupational classification, hours worked, and wages paid. Do not submit weekly payroll reports to DLS. A sample of a payroll reporting form may be obtained at http://www.mass.gov/dols/pw.
- Contractors with questions about the wage rates or classifications included on the wage schedule have an affirmative obligation to inquire with DLS at (617) 626-6953.
- Employees not receiving the prevailing wage rate set forth on the wage schedule may report the violation to the Fair Labor Division of the office of the Attorney General at (617) 727-3465.
- Failure of a contractor or subcontractor to pay the prevailing wage rates listed on the wage schedule to all employees who perform construction work on the project is a violation of the law and subjects the contractor or subcontractor to civil and




