
BOARD DETAILS



Committee Objective

The Sustainability Committee hereinafter referred to as the "Committee" shall provide the Town of Natick and the Natick community at large with active leadership and practical solutions in reducing costs, mitigating environmental impacts and preparing for future environmental challenges. In this capacity, the Committee will be responsible for:

- Evaluating Natick's environmental impacts, challenges and opportunities.
- Recommending sustainability goals and prioritizing their implementation.
- Engaging municipal and school departments, businesses, institutions and volunteer groups to achieve sustainability goals.
- Supporting the implementation of sustainability programs.
- Monitoring and measuring the effectiveness of sustainability programs undertaken by the Town.

The Committee will work collaboratively with various departments, including Community and Economic Development, Facilities Management, Public Works, and Natick Public Schools, as well as other Town and School Committees, to advise on sustainability issues and implement Committee goals. As needed, members from various Town departments and Natick Public Schools may be asked to serve as liaisons to the Committee based on project needs.

Composition and Terms of Office

The Committee shall be comprised of seven (7) voting members, including the Natick Town Administrator or her designee and the Superintendent of Natick Public Schools or his designee. The Committee will receive staff support from the Sustainability Coordinator.

Qualifications for serving on the Committee include having expertise in and a passion for sustainability.

Committee members should have demonstrable experience in areas such as environmental law, environmental education, corporate responsibility, environmental science, energy management, environmental health and safety, sustainability communications, green building, land use planning, water conservation, resiliency planning, or other related fields.

Based on the composition of the Committee and its need for specific areas of expertise, the Town Administrator or her designee, in consultation with the Committee, will provide the Board of Selectmen with specific preferred attributes and skill sets of prospective members prior to the advertising of Committee vacancies.

Appointments will be made by the Board of Selectmen. Committee members appointed by the Board of Selectmen shall serve for a term of

three (3) years except that one (1) of the initial appointees shall serve for a term of two (2) years and one (1) for one (1) year so that one such member's term will expire on an annual basis. All other members shall serve for a term of three (3) years. Terms shall coincide with the fiscal year (effective July 1) and expire on June 30th. The Committee shall meet no less than 10 times per year, and more frequently as warranted. At the first meeting after the start of each new fiscal year, the Committee shall conduct an organizational meeting to elect from its members a Chair, Vice-Chair and Secretary.

I was impressed with Leo's leadership in conducting the meeting, the deep level of knowledge the members clearly had during our various discussions and the suggestions they made for accomplishing their agenda. So, no, after attending just a single meeting, I cannot think of any changes I would like to see.

If being committed and persistent is a skill, then I bring a level that is unparalleled. Once I commit to seeing something through to fruition, I am unstoppable. Such as being the only charter member of the Boston Recycling Coalition to stay with the group and attend every single monthly meeting the entire 5+ years till we achieved full curbside recycling; pulling three "all-nighters" in a row for the Executive Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs compiling, editing, and formatting information after weeks of research and phone calls, to meet a deadline for a revised state-wide Environmental Education Resource Guide for teachers, which I expanded from sixteen 8½ x 5½ pages to sixty 8½ x 11 pages; to standing up to Boston's DPW commissioner at our monthly Mayor's Recycling Advisory Committee meetings to counter every effort he made to thwart our effort to launch a full, city-wide, single-stream recycling program. I also planned and choreographed the Boston Recycling Coalition's unforgettable kick-off mock "Town Meeting" (our "Recycling Revival") that was held in September 1989 in the same 2nd floor Great Hall at Faneuil Hall where our forefathers held so many meetings and protests some 240 years ago, profoundly impacting and shaping this country; produced and edited CrunchTime's educational video about the tropical rain forest which was shot on location in Costa Rica; was a contest judge for the live presentation at seven straight Massachusetts' Envirothon competitions; spent ten weeks traveling around the country one summer camping in state and national parks while collecting data and writing a 14-week environmental education unit while a student at Lesley College (now University). Lastly—and I could go on, relentlessly, I traveled extensively up and down the East Coast by car exhibiting at trade shows promoting CrunchTime, drumming up so much business, Paul Newman's daughter's business partner wanted me to spearhead a fund raising division within Newman's Own Organics at their Aptos, California headquarters. Too many anchors on the East Coast preventing me from making that move to California. Then I found Natick, my home of 15+ years, and probably for life. And while I'm still above ground, I'll do everything within my power to make it the greenest community in Massachusetts. Whatever technical skills or know how I lack, I believe I make up with creative, out-of-the-box thinking and my overarching commitment to protect and preserve Earth's myriad ecosystems, which are all being assaulted by the effects of Climate Change.

I have also done many interior improvements as a DIYer (e.g., building an extensive "California-style" closet, renting a van to pick up in NYC and then installing with the help of a friend, a wrought iron spiral staircase I found on ebay) to my 1870 two-family home, and transforming it into a showcase property); cabinetmaking, cooking, gardening, landscaping, running (have run many 5 and 10k races, completed a 25k in less than two hours, and completed the Boston Marathon on a bipartite patella (kneecap in two pieces), falling short of the official 3:30 qualifying time by about 20 minute; biking (have completed the two-day, 192-mile Pan Mass Challenge), hiking, camping, kayaking, skiing, tennis, golf, basketball, backgammon and other board games, reading, writing, public speaking, travel (spent ten weeks and covered 15,500 miles traveling all around the country and parts of Canada, exploring our National Parks and camping out the majority of the time). Lastly, as further commitment to the environment, I now drive a second-hand Ford C-max Energi: a combination plug-in electric/hybrid vehicle.
