Citizens Request to address Wrong Way Parking	<p>Committee VOTED to Recommend to Board of Selectmen to clarify Article IV Stopping, Standing and Parking 480-13 General Prohibitions – Item E of the Traffic Rules and Orders by adding the following to the beginning of the existing paragraph:</p> <p>E. Wrong Way Parking and Proper Distance from Curb.</p> <p>Upon any roadway where parking is permitted unless both wheels on the right side of the motor vehicle are within 12 inches of the curb or edge of the roadway, except upon those streets which are designated as one-way streets. On such one-way streets, motor vehicles shall be parked in the direction in which said motor vehicle is moving and with both wheels within 12 inches of the curb. This shall not apply to streets or parts of streets where angle parking is required by these rules and regulations.</p>	March 7, 2019
Request for Change of Address from 34 A West Central Street to 34R West Central Street	<p>Committee VOTED to recommend to the Board of Selectmen to hold a Public Hearing to change address of 34A West Central Street to 34R West Central Street.</p>	August 13, 2019

Request for “Hidden Driveway” sign in the vicinity of 78 Winter Street.	Committee VOTED to recommend to Board of Selectmen to erect MUTCD compliant sign in the vicinity of 78 Winter Street in both directions alerting motorists of HIDDEN DRIVEWAY.	August 13, 2019
Request to address Pedestrian Safety on Keene Road	Committee VOTED to recommend to Board of Selectmen to erect 2 MUTCD compliant “CHILDREN” signs on both ends of Keene Road. Location of signs to be determined by DPW Highway Supervisor.	August 13, 2019
Request for Stop Sign on Westlake Road at Waring Road.	Committee VOTED to recommend to Board of Selectmen to erect MUTCD compliant, STOP Sign, STOP Line, and stenciled “STOP” on Westlake Road at Waring Road in both directions creating a 4 Way STOP.	August 13, 2019
