	default speed limits on some or all town roads, or establishing future safety zones. Lower vehicle
	speeds are part of a strategy to improve safety and make our roads more welcoming to all users.

Response	Article 23 is part of a continuum of efforts to improve safety and accessibility for all residents and visitors by ensuring our streets are welcoming, safe and designed for the needs of all residents and visitors. It is complementary to the Complete Streets policy and initiative and consistent with the safety and accessibility goals of the Natick 2030 Master Plan (Section 4, Transportation).
