| Response | Move that the Town appropriate the sum of \$100,000 to be expended under the direction of the Select Board for the purpose of supplementing contingency funding of the Phase 2 associated work for construction of the new Fire Station located at 268 Speen Street, Natick, Massachusetts, 01760, including all related facilities, buildings, appurtenant structures, site improvements, and grounds; and that to meet this appropriation the sum of \$100,000 be appropriated from the Capital Stabilization Fund. |
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| 2 | At a summary level and very clearly, what is the proposed purpose and objective of this Warrant Article and the accompanying Motion? |
| Response | To provide contingency funding for the completion for Phase 2 of the West Natick Fire Station project. |
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| 3 | Has this article or one of a very similar scope and substance been on a previous Warrant Article and what have been the actions taken by the Finance Committee, other Boards or Committees and Town Meeting? |
| Response | Yes, funds requested are in addition to funds appropriated under Article 33 of the 2016 Spring Annual Town Meeting, Article 22 of the 2017 Spring Annual Town Meeting and Article 15 of the 2018 Fall Annual Town Meeting |

| Response | This funding is desired to ensure the West Natick Fire Station project can be completed in its entirety as planned. |

| Response | The proposed motion supports the final phase of construction of the West Natick Fire Station project. This project has been under consideration, planning, design and construction for many years. The project is nearing completion, but has seen cost increases due to unknown, on site environmental contamination and remediation work (completed). Contingency funding for the project is limited as the project enters Phase 2 and in order to complete the project, an additional amount of contingency funding is being requested. These funds will only be utilized if needed due to unforeseen circumstances. |

| Response | Phase 2 of the WNFS project includes, but is not limited to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Demolition of the old fire station and removing all materials including the basement • Excavation on the old building site and the installation of the final Storm Water Retention & Management components to be located under the old Fire Station building |

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| | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Final connections for the permanent utilities which includes groundwork• Completion of the access driveway on Speen Street to the new curb cuts which runs across the old Fire Station lot and the footprint of the old building and final layer of the asphalt for that area• Completion of the so-called Pocket Park to be located on the site of the old building• Other smaller elements of Phase 2 that will be required to meet the final completion of the project <p>While it is anticipated that the project contingency balance heading into Phase 2 may be as high as \$50k, there is no guarantee since this project is ongoing. Further, \$50k for Phase 2, which is estimated to cost approximately \$1M to complete, is concerning given the complexities of the Phase and the timing of the work. Phase 2 will be completed over the late spring and summer months, which means if funding is needed to finish the project, the ability to secure funding is limited. This may lead to components of the project not being completed, project delays, or other project impacts.</p> |
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
