### Sponsorships

- Sponsorships have been identified as a way to recoup Town expenses
- 2017 legislation to authorize Natick and Framingham to sell bridge naming rights was not successful due to legal concerns at MassDOT
- The Town has an agreement with the Friends of Natick Trails, which has provided \$100,000 +/- to date through signage, bricks, and benches
- Spring 2021 Town Meeting established a revolving fund for CRT Maintenance

#### Maintenance and Operations

- The DPW Land Facilities and Natural Resources Division will perform maintenance
- Town oversight and administration is under the Select Board/Town Administration

### **Future Connectivity**

- Lake Cochituate Path connecting to West Natick neighborhoods
  - MassDOT project at 25% design; scheduled for TIP in FFY 2025
- Natick Center/MBTA Station connection
  - Path level connection to outbound platform to be constructed by MBTA
  - Viaduct to Main Street is approaching 25% design
  - \$300,000 design c/o by MassTrails & MetroWest Health Foundation grants
  - Scheduled for TIP TBD
- Cochituate State Park connection
  - Construction by DCR late 2021/Spring 2022
- Future connections to Bruce Freeman Rail Trail
  - City of Framingham initiative
