	This language has been reviewed and approved by Town Counsel.
2	At a summary level and very clearly, what is the proposed purpose and objective of this Warrant Article and the accompanying Motion?
Response	Town Meeting members voted to accept the Community Preservation Act (M.G.L. c. 44B) at the 2022 Spring Town Meeting and residents voted in the 2022 fall election to adopt the Community Preservation Act. Per M.G.L. c. 44B, a Community Preservation Committee needs to be established to review projects requesting funding through the Community Preservation Fund, and provide recommendations to Town Meeting to appropriate the funding. The bylaw will serve to establish the Committee and outline the duties, composition, and administration, which can be further refined through regulations adopted by the Committee once established.
3	Has this article or one of a very similar scope and substance been on a previous Warrant Article and what have been the actions taken by the Finance Committee, other Boards or Committees and Town Meeting?
Response	No.
4	Why is it required for the Town of Natick and for the Town Agency sponsor(s)?
Response	As the voters approved the adoption of the Community Preservation Act, a Community Preservation Committee must be established to regulate the funds once they become available.

Response	There were significant community engagement efforts by the group of residents who sponsored the STM 2021 warrant article and through the election.

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	The Conservation Commission has an item on their 3/2/23 agenda to determine if they will vote to endorse the article. The Open Space Advisory Committee is planning to discuss and vote on endorsement at their 3/13/23 meeting. The Planning Board is planning to discuss and vote on endorsement at their 3/15/23 meeting. The Recreation and Parks Commission is planning to discuss and vote on endorsement at their 3/6/23 meeting. All of the meetings listed above are public meetings with the option for public comment.
