Dear Natick Selectboard members,

I am writing to you all today in regards to a rumor that you will be voting on Natick becoming a sanctuary town. As a State Committee member for the Republican Party I'm sure you are not surprised that I find this to be a bad idea. I am sure many of you, if not all of you voted differently from me two weeks ago. But that does not mean we can't find common ground. I know emotions are high following the Presidential election but I ask we use our minds rather than our emotions.
